



**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. PCG-003
SERIES OF 2022**

**AN EXECUTIVE ORDER PLACING THE CITY OF PASIG UNDER ALERT LEVEL 2 FROM 01
FEBRUARY UNTIL 15 FEBRUARY 2022**

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (**COVID-19**), since having been declared as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (**PHEIC**), has irreversibly affected millions of lives and families worldwide. Its unprecedented speed of transmission and infectivity has placed a huge burden on essential area of governance, most importantly in vulnerable sectors such as the economy, education, and healthcare;

WHEREAS, Section 15 Article II of the 1987 Constitution states that the State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among its constituents;

WHEREAS, Section 2 (b) of Executive Order No. 168, Series of 2014 mandates the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (**IATF**) to prevent and/or minimize the entry of suspected or confirmed patients with emerging infectious diseases into the country;

WHEREAS, the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases passed Resolution 159-A, Series of 2022, dated 29 January 2022 which deescalated the National Capital Region to Alert Level 2 beginning 01 February until 15 February 2022;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, VICTOR MA. REGIS N. SOTTO, Mayor of Pasig City, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. ADOPTION OF IATF RESOLUTION NO. 159-A (S. 2022). – The City Government of Pasig adopts the guidelines on the implementation of Alert Level System 2 in the National Capital Region from 01 February 2022 to 15 February 2022.

SECTION 2. INTRAZONAL AND INTERZONAL TRAVEL FOR MINORS, SENIOR CITIZENS, AND THOSE WITH COMMORBIDITIES. – Intrazonal and interzonal travel shall be allowed for minors, senior citizens, and those with comorbidities at all times.

SECTION 3. GAMING ESTABLISHMENTS. – Casinos, horse racing, cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments shall not be allowed to operate, or be undertaken in areas classified under Alert Level 2 except as may be authorized by the IATF or the Office of the President.

SECTION 4. ESTABLISHMENTS, OR ACTIVITIES, ALLOWED TO OPERATE OR BE UNDERTAKEN. – The following establishments, or activities, shall be allowed to operate, or be undertaken at a maximum of 50% indoor venue capacity for fully vaccinated individuals



and those below 18 years of age, even if unvaccinated, and 70% outdoor venue capacity.

Provided, that all workers/employees of these establishments are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and MPHS shall be strictly maintained. Provided further, that there is no objection from the LGU where these activities may take place.

- a. Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions (MICE);
- b. Permitted venues for social events such as parties, wedding receptions, engagement parties, wedding anniversaries, debut and birthday parties, family reunions, and bridal or baby showers;
- c. Visitor or tourist attractions such as libraries, archives, museums, galleries, exhibits, parks, plazas, public gardens, scenic viewpoints or overlooks, and the like;
- d. Amusement parks or theme parks;
- e. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, skating rinks, archery halls, swimming pools, and similar venues;
- f. Cinemas and movie houses;
- g. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for basic education subject to prior approval of the Office of the President;
- h. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for higher education and for technical-vocational education and training;
- i. In-person religious gatherings; gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 and for the cremains of the COVID-19 deceased;
- j. Licensure or entrance/qualifying examinations administered by their respective government agency, and specialty examinations authorized by the IATF subject to the health and safety guidelines as approved by the IATF;
- k. Dine-in services of food preparation establishments such as kiosks, commissaries, restaurants, and eateries, subject to DTI sector-specific protocols;
- l. Personal care establishments such as barbershops, hair spas, hair salons, and nail spas, and those offering aesthetic/cosmetic services or procedures, make-up services, salons, spas, reflexology, and other similar procedures including home service options, subject to the sector-specific protocols of the DTI;



- m. Fitness studios, gyms, and venues for individual non-contact exercise and sports, subject to DTI sector-specific protocols. Provided that patrons/clients and workers/employees wear face masks at all times and that no group activities are conducted;
- n. Film, music, and television production subject to the joint guidelines as may be issued by the DTI, DOLE, and the DOH;
- o. Contact sports, subject to the next Sections;
- p. Funfairs/peryas or kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom, and kiddie rides;
- q. Venues with live voice or wind-instrument performers and audiences such as in karaoke bars, clubs, concert halls, and theaters; and
- r. Gatherings in residences with individuals not belonging to the same household.

SECTION 5. CONTACT SPORTS. – Only fully vaccinated persons shall be allowed to participate and spectate in indoor and outdoor organized or unorganized contact sports

Player-Participants have the option not to wear face masks only during the play. Otherwise, players should wear face masks and observe the minimum public health standards as prescribed by the IATF.

However, player-participants or spectators who are **symptomatic** shall not be allowed to play or watch the event. Further, the City Government of Pasig through the Office of the City Administrator shall have the prerogative to allow or disallow spectators in any contact sport event as the circumstances may require.

SECTION 6. ORGANIZED CONTACT SPORT EVENT. – Organized contact sport events shall include those where there are identifiable or determinable organizers, participants, venues, and schedules.

The organizer and/or venue owner or operator thereof shall secure the necessary permit from the City Government of Pasig through the Office of the City Administrator and declare the nature of the event, number of participants, and duration and further ensure and undertake that venue capacity limitations, vaccination requirements, and minimum public health standards are strictly enforced. Moreover, the organizer and/or venue owner or operator shall have a written registry and health declaration of participants, spectators, and all other persons in the event therein stating their names, addresses, and contact numbers and conduct temperature check and verification of vaccination cards.



SECTION 7. UNORGANIZED CONTACT SPORT EVENT. – Unorganized contact sport events shall include those events that are random or spontaneous where there are no evident organizers, participants, and schedules.

The concerned Barangay Officials, HOAs, and/or venue owner or operator thereof shall supervise and ensure observance of venue capacity limitations, vaccination requirements, and Minimum Public Health Standards.

SECTION 8. ALLOWED CONTACT SPORTS VENUES. – Contact sports may be undertaken in the following venues:

- (a) City owned or operated multi-purpose courts or venues;
- (b) Barangay owned or operated multi-purpose courts or venues;
- (c) Home Owners' Associations' owned or operated multi-purpose courts or venues; and
- (d) Private Establishments with valid business permits for the operation of sports facilities.

SECTION 9. MAXIMUM VENUE CAPACITY FOR CONTACT SPORTS. – During the event, organizers, operators, HOAs, and barangay officials, as the case may be, have the responsibility of ensuring venue capacity limitations:

- (a) Seventy percent (70%) capacity for outdoor venues; and
- (b) Fifty Percent (50%) capacity for indoor venues.

SECTION 10. LIABILITY OF PARTICIPANTS, BARANGAYS, HOAS, AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS. – The participants, barangays officials, HOAs, and the registered business owners shall be liable for any violation of the Minimum Public Health Standards.

SECTION 11. ADDITIONAL VENUE AND SEATING CAPACITY BEYOND THE EXISTING ALLOWABLE VENUE/SEATING CAPACITIES. – Business establishments are allowed additional venue/seating capacity beyond the existing allowable venue/seating capacity, as follows:

- a. Additional twenty percentage (20%) points – If the area where such establishments are located has a vaccination coverage above seventy percent (70%) for Priority Group A2 (senior citizens) and Priority Group A3 (adults with comorbidities), as determined by the Vaccine Cluster of the National Task Force Against COVID-19; and
- b. Additional ten percentage (10%) points – If said business establishments have been awarded Safety Seal Certification (DOLE-DOH-DILG-DOT-DTI Joint Memorandum Circular No. 21-01, Series of 2021).



SECTION 12. ALTERNATIVE WORK ARRANGEMENTS (AWA) FOR CITY GOVERNMENT OFFICES/DEPARTMENTS. – Under Alert Level System 2, all services of the City Governments shall be operational, subject to the following work capacities of the following City Government offices/departments:

a) Full Operational Capacity

All City Government offices/departments primarily engaged in medical, peace and order, vaccination program, City Census Program, *ayuda* distribution efforts of the City, and disaster response shall remain to be fully operational, such as but not limited to, the City Health Department (CHD), all City-run hospitals, Peace and Order Department (POD), Pasig City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (DRRMO), and all its related divisions and offices.

In addition to these offices, the following Departments and Offices shall also be fully operational:

b) 80% Operational Capacity

All other Departments and Offices not mentioned above shall adopt a eighty percent (80%) AWA.

These Departments and Offices are hereby ordered to submit their Personnel Complement Schedule indicating those individuals who shall report to work on-site during the allowed days.

c) The City Mayor Reserves the right to require any department, office, unit, or employee to report physically to work, when needed.



SECTION 13. SUSPENSION OF EFFECTIVITY OF ORDINANCE NO. 01, SERIES OF 2022. –

Pursuant to Section 7 of Ordinance No. 01, Series of 2022, entitled “An Ordinance Adopting the Enhanced Restrictions of Unvaccinated Individuals by the Metro Manila Development Authority to Regulate their Mobility in the National Capital Region”, the effectivity of which is suspended upon the declaration of Alert Level 2 in the City of Pasig.

SECTION 14. CONTINUED EFFECTIVITY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT POLICIES. –

All COVID-19 related issuances, executive orders, and policies of the City Government of Pasig, insofar as they are not in contradiction to the mandates this EO or of the national government, such as curfew hours, allowed activities, and allowed individual movements, shall continue to subsist and be implemented with full effect. The force and effectivity of the same will be without prejudice to any further changes in the mandates of the local or national government.

SECTION 15. DISSEMINATION. –

Copies of this Executive Order shall be furnished within seventy-two (72) hours from its issuance to the Office of the President and the Department of Health for their information and guidance.

SECTION 16. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. –

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon its approval and shall remain in effect for the entirety of the Alert Level System 2.
